

Panigel was born in Bulgaria, but his family emigrated to the [Land of Israel](#) when he was a child. In 1828 and in 1863 he was an [emissary](#) on behalf of Jerusalem to the countries of North Africa, remaining there on both occasions for several years. In 1845 he travelled to Italy as an emissary of Hebron and was received with great respect at the Vatican by Pope [Gregory XVI](#). In 1880 he became [rishon le-Zion](#), and in 1890 the Ottoman authorities appointed him [hacham bashi](#) (head of the Jewish community of Palestine). He was held in great esteem by all communities and authorities. He authored Lev Marpe (1887), talmudic novellae, responsa, and homilies.[1] His son-in-law, [Jacob Saul Elyashar](#), later succeeded him.

**Elijah Moses Panigel** (1850–1919) was the [sephardi](#) chief rabbi of the Ottoman Empire, Palestine and Jerusalem.

Orphaned in at a young age, Panigel was brought up by his uncle [Raphael Meir Panigel](#), the [rishon le-Zion](#) (sephardi chief rabbi of Palestine). He was sent to Algeria to collect funds for the [Misgav Ladach Hospital](#) in Jerusalem and to North Africa, Italy, India, the Caucasus and Bokhara, by the Jerusalem

community.[1] After the death of [Jacob Saul Elyashar](#) in 1906, a dispute arose within the community as to whom should be appointed his successor. The more modern members supported [Jacob Meir](#) while the more traditional supported Chaim Moses Elyashar.[2] Meir assumed the position for a few months before he was deposed by the Sultan of Turkey. In 1907 Panigel was chosen as [hacham bashi](#) and [rishon le-Zion](#) but he was forced to resign 1908.[1] Rabbi Nachman Batito subsequently served as deputy chief rabbi from 1909 to 1911 whereupon Rabbi Moses Franco of Rhodes was appointed chief rabbi until 1915.[2] When Jerusalem was captured by the British in 1917, Panigel publicly welcomed [General Allenby](#) and the [Jewish Legion](#).

### THE MATRIARCH

She was the only daughter of the Rishon Lezion, Chief Rabbi of Palestine, Rafael Meier Panigel and Vinizia Halevy Panigel. She had only one biological brother, Yehuda Shlomo Panigel who died young and two adopted brothers: Yehuda Bechar and Eliahu Moshe Bechar Panigel that her father "adopted" and raised/educated.

She was married to the Rishon Lezion Hayyim Moshe Eliachar. They had nine children, six sons: Joseph, Isaac, Moreno, Jacob, Meier and David and three daughters: Esther Eliachar Calamaro, Simha

Eliachar Meyouhas and Beya Eliachar Haffif. They also adopted two children as was the custom then, one boy, Abraham, and one girl, Gracia. They had twenty-five grandchildren and over thirty-five to forty great grand children. She was blessed with a long and healthy life; she has known and enjoyed most of them and also some great-great-grand-children.

Some of the other names of the families who are descendant from her are, as of today: Abravanel, Amzalek, Btech, Bivas, Bru, Cohen, Douek, Horvatz, Mizrahi, Navon, Nuhim, Sabah, Safdieh, Sakal, Sasson, Shammaa, Smouha. Weil, Weinberg, Zeimer. (Note: Some of these names may not be in use by any of her descendants because they are the maiden names of their mother or the maiden names of married women descendants from her).

She was referred as “La Mana Grande”, which could be from the Spanish “Grand-Mother” and it also could come from the French “La Grande Dame” (the Great Lady) for indeed she was “a Grand Lady” by pedigree, ascendance, the descendants that she engendered and her life achievements and devotion. She was the sole surviving biological child of her parent and she engendered a large progeny. As the wife of the Chief Rabbi of the Holy Land of Palestine she contributed immensely to her husband, her family and all the communities of the land. She was “The Matriarch” of the clan. Her descendants are currently scattered all over the world. They lived in Egypt, Lebanon and other parts of the Arab world and the Ottoman Empire until the Middle East crises and the creation of the State of Israel when the Jewish communities of most of these countries were eradicated. Currently they are mostly scattered within the “western” countries such as France, the United States of America, Canada, Brazil, and Argentina among others. She lived until past of the creation of the state of Israel and when she passed away, she and her families who lived in the neighboring Arab countries had probably not met each other ever again since that time in 1948.

She was a known healer, wise and spiritual. She kept plants that she cultivated for the cure and relief of ailments. She was well educated and very knowledgeable and experienced in this science that she constantly researched and improved. She was consulted on this subject by all: family, neighbors, friends, and beyond. She was a pious and religious woman and a modest one notwithstanding of all her accomplishments. Though a traditionalist she was quite a forward looking, progressive woman. Her daughters were educated at par with her sons. All who knew her and whose life she touched acknowledged her as a miracle health worker for her skilled performance of the awesome results of her treatments. She would do it casually with care and sensitivity benevolently to all that she met and came to her in need to seek her service. Her memory can only be a blessing to all her descendants and the world. May it always be so with the grace of G-d.

A brief Portrait of Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar by Albert Bivas

Rabbi Hayim Moshe Eliachar, 1845-1924, was the last chief Rabbi, Rishon Lezion of Palestine under the Ottoman Empire and the first one during the British occupation of Palestine. He was the eldest son of the Rishon Lezion Rabbi Yacob Shaul Eliachar. He had two brothers who were also Rabbis: Rabbi Nessim Benyamin Mardohay and Rabbi Eliezer Yeruham. He married Vida Panijel, the daughter of the Rishon Lezion Rabbi Raphael Meir Panijel. They had 9 children, three daughters and six sons. They also adopted, as was some customs then, two orphan children, a boy and a girl. Two of his sons were also rabbis, Rabbi Joseph Eliachar and Rabbi Jacob Eliachar. A third son was offered the position of assistant to the chief Rabbi of the Ottoman Empire, Rabbi Hayyim Nahum, but he refused it because he preferred a more secular life. This son later became a first deputy mayor of Jerusalem under the British mandate of Palestine.

Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar's ancestral family had immigrated, made aliyah, into Palestine, the Holy Land, some 500 years earlier. They were one of prominent families of the city of Ijar in Spain of that time. They got their name "Eliachar" because they were referred as "Il Ijar" because of their provenance from that city. Although they were fully Sepharadim and identify as such, in 1716, one of them, Rabbi Joseph Eliachar married the daughter of Rabbi Jacob Vilna, a descendant of the Vilna Gaon.

Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar was a linguist. He spoke at least six languages: Arabic, Turkish, Hebrew, French, English and Spanish/Ladino. He was very erudite in both religious and secular matters on the one hand and competent in academic as well as practical matters on the other hand. Though a traditionalist, he was also a progressist and never flinched in his efforts to improve human conditions. Some highlights of his accomplishments where his support for equal rights for women and their full participation in all activities. He implicitly decided in favor of the right to vote for women. He urged the unification of Jews of Palestine into one single community and the peaceful coexistence of all communities Jews, Christians, Moslems, Arabs and all in Palestine.

Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar lived in his official residence in the Mekor Barukh quarter with his

family. This residence was comprised of a large synagogue and apartments for the private use of the Rabbis. Rabbi Raphael Meir Panijel and Rabbi Yacob Shaul Eliachar also lived there prior to Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar. This house stayed in their family until the late 1950's after the death of Rabbi Jacob Eliachar, the son of Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar, who lived there and maintained it, after which the synagogue was kept open by the family for one year for the period of mourning and "kadish" for Rabbi Jacob Eliachar and then it was closed, liquidated and everything was transferred to the new residence of the new Rishonim Lezion, chief Rabbis of Eretz Israel.

Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar's Hebrew initials are "Het Mem Alef" which pronounce "Hama". It is ironic that this word, a name by which he was also known is almost the same as "Hamas" the Arab Palestinian organization. Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar liked all his neighbors, his co-nationals, he wanted and led a peaceful coexistence with all of them. They were all his friends. Jews, Christians, Moslems, Arabs and all were his friends and entitled to the same "human rights and considerations".

Rabbi Hayyim Moshe Eliachar's name "Hayyim Moshe" may be translated into "Mashiah lives" from the Hebrew "Hayyi-(m) Moshe--iah". Is this a cue? Is Mashiah with us and about to be revealed to us? Should it have been revealed to us? Was he the one? Have we missed another chance for redemption? I hope not. We know though that he shall come. NOW! It is only up to us to prepare his welcome.

We called her Aunt "Biyutcha" and I remember when she came to Jerusalem from Egypt to visit.<sup>6</sup>

Beya Haffif nee Eliachar died in November 1956 in Cairo, Egypt during the "Suez Campaign" war. Some people ascribed it to the worries that we all had at that time in Egypt because of this event. She worried enormously about the situation that caused her much sadness and anxiety. I remembered that when she died her husband, Joseph Haffif, told to people that she had wanted to go to what had become "Israel", the land we knew as Palestine, where she was born and most of her family lived, separated from each other since 1948.<sup>2</sup>



Elie Eliachar was a member of the first 2 Kenesseth in the early days of the State of Israel in the Sepharadi Party. He lost his final try for reelection amid strong suspicions that he was the victim of fraud by people opposed to him and sepharadim. He was critical of the treatment of sepharadim on the one hand and the arabs of Israel on the other hand by the Ashkenazim in control. in 1959, after the the World Jewish Congress (where sepharadim were mostly excluded like in many other such venues) in stockholm, many sepharadim, including Ellie Eliachar, went on their own to talk to them about the ill treatment of these Sepharadim and Orientals in Israel. As this news spread well in the international press, there were barely any mention of it in Israel proper, a subject that the power in control always silenced. It further has been discovered that in order to do so the then ministre of Foreign Affairs Moshe Sharett had sent a message to the Jewish Agency specifying: "Kill Eliachar".

### **MY FATHER, MY BELOVED TEACHER**

Elie Eliachar, scion of an ancient Sephardi family and outstanding leader of the Sephardi community in Israel and in the diaspora, was born in Jerusalem in 1899 and died there in 1981. His autobiography, "Living with Jews", covered a lifetime that spanned the turbulent Ottoman, British and Israeli periods in the Land of Israel.

He traveled to Beirut in his early teens, to study medicine. In 1915 he was enlisted to the Turkish army's medical corps, in which he served till the Ottoman Empire's capitulation. T

During the following years he struggled to complete and expand his education, shifting from medicine to law.

Elie Eliachar made his first steps in public service in 1918, upon return to Jerusalem from his imposed service in the Turkish army. Shortly after the Balfour Declaration he enthusiastically joined the Zionist Jewish renaissance, soon to assume a leading position in promotion of equal representation with full participation of the Sephardi community, both in The Land Of Israel and in the diaspora, in promoting the establishment of the Jewish national homeland

In 1936, Elie Eliachar was nominated to represent the Yishuv, before the Peel Royal Commission. His

visionary manifest on the Arab–Jewish Conflict is a comprehensive representation of the Jewish rights on the land, combined with negotiable proposals to bring about reconciliation with the Arab population. These submissions are valid to this very day.

His career was notably multifaceted, embracing pioneering business pursuits and a passionate commitment to his community and public life. At various times, his business dealings extended throughout the Middle East. He initiated developments such as drilling for oil, construction of housing projects, while being cofounder of the first civilian airline in Palestine and co-owner of Israel's largest rice mill. In 1947 as a representative of the Jewish Agency, he journeyed throughout South America, launching the foundations of the future embassies and consulates of the budding State of Israel. He served as deputy mayor of Jerusalem and was a member of the first and second Knesset. He was active in the peace movement, serving to his last days as honorary President of the Israel-Palestine Peace Council. He countered prominent statesmen from many lands, including several Arab countries, amongst his personal friends.

Throughout his career he projected great compassion for the Jewish State and all the groups within it. He edited several periodicals and was an inexhaustible speaker, fluent in many languages and a prolific commentator.

Eliachar perceived the social dynamics inherent in communal tensions between Sephardim and Ashkenazim and foresaw the inevitable dangers that lay in store for the Jewish State as a result of ethnic discrimination. He was also ahead of his contemporaries in his views on relations between Jews and Arabs in the Land of Israel and the neighboring countries. He warned of the isolationist trends that overtook the Zionist movement in its conflict with the Arabs and warned that such separatism could lead to a perilous rift between the Jewish community and its neighbors.


In his books, "Living with Jews" and his many articles, he expressed his dauntless efforts to change these attitudes.

Tragically, such optimistic endeavors and struggles to bring about peace between the Arabs the Jews have so far been to no avail.

Current reality, exposes the vital terms that must be achieved for peace to prevail in the Middle East: Arab countries must acknowledge and accept their defeat in their wars against Israel, recognize Israel as the legitimate rightful homeland of the Jewish people, and as the losing side should, pay Israel reparations for the more than 60 years of devastation they have enacted upon it.

### **Simon Nathan, 82, Photographer and Writer**

Simon Nathan, a photographer and writer whose "Simon Sez" columns in popular photography magazines kept professionals and hobbyists up to date with the innovations of camera makers after World War II, died on May 19 in the Bronx. He was 82.

A longtime Manhattan resident, he died in a nursing home in Riverdale, said his daughter, Nancy Nathan. His most recent residence was in East Orange, N.J.

Mr. Nathan began writing his column in the 1950's, when Japanese cameras were first making their way to America to challenge advanced German models. Appearing in Popular Photography, Modern Photography and other magazines, the column, which gained a reputation for keen reporting of technical breakthroughs, was an opinionated guide to new equipment that also offered tips on how to shoot various subjects.

Mr. Nathan also produced a number of books for Fawcett during the 1950's, including "Good Photography's 35mm Handbook," "Good Photography's Darkroom Guide" and "Camera in Paris."

He was particularly interested in panoramic photography, a field that caught his attention while working for the Flying Tigers freight line. Faced with the challenge of photographing cargo planes, he worked with camera builders on a hand-held camera

capable of producing undistorted large-format pictures.

He later applied his panoramic techniques on assignment to make photographic stills for Hollywood epics like "Waterloo," and "Khartoum" as well as for nine James Bond films. A 1989 panoramic photo of the United Nations, taken from the Fuji blimp, appears on a United Nations postage stamp.

Simon Morris Nathan was born on July 28, 1921, in Westview, Pa., and graduated from the University of Dayton.

His marriage to Ida Wyman ended in divorce. Besides his daughter, Nancy, of Riverdale, he is survived by his son, David, of Birmingham, Ala.; his sisters, Marjorie Koch and Patricia Sloan, both of Montgomery, Ala.; his brothers, Robert of Huntsville, Ala., and David of California; and a grandchild.
