

Papal Aide in Palestine Guides Shrine Protection

ROME, May 10—Msgr. Gustavo Testa, Archbishop of Amasea and recently appointed Apostolic delegate to Palestine, will leave soon for the Holy Land to supervise protection of holy places, Vatican sources said today.

These sources said Msgr. Testa would assume the regular duties of supervising Catholic clergy of various rites in Palestine. Pope Pius XII appointed him Apostolic delegate two months ago.

Msgr. Testa is not being sent as a personal representative of the Pope for the duration of the Palestine war, but as a permanent representative, informants said. He served as Apostolic delegate to Palestine and Egypt before World War II. British Msgr. Arthur Hughes, Archbishop of Aepro, succeeded him.
